

Nytt År I Norge

In Norway and other Scandinavian countries, New Year's Eve is the culmination of Jul, the Christmas season. Romjul, the week between Christmas and New Year's, is spent entertaining friends and family while sharing leftovers from Christmas Dinner. On New Year's Eve itself, Nyttår, friends will traditionally gather at a home and share more food. In some parts of Norway children may participate in Julebukk, where youth dress in costumes and go door to door to receive treats like clementines, nuts and candies. Around midnight guests often enjoy a small fireworks display. In some larger communities, cities may have their own fireworks displays. (from Viking e-post)
