NORWEGIANS ARE HAPPY!

A recent study by a London-based think tank, the Legatum Institute, ranked Norway #1 on their Prosperity Index. (The U.S. was the only large country making the top 10, and was #10). The study weighed a variety of both subjective and objective criteria in determining happiness/prosperity. For instance, factors such as health, education and the economy are all measured by both the statistical data supporting them and the perceived quality and confidence of the public. Norway has the world's highest per capita GDP of \$53,000 a year. They have the second-highest satisfaction with their standard of living, with 95% saying they are satisfied with the freedom to choose the direction of their lives. 74% of Norwegians believe other people can be trusted, more than any other country.
